

Spirituality: how we live out what we most profoundly believe.



Who were the Celts?

- keltoi = strangers or hidden ones
- ceilt = an act of concealing
- a rural, tribal, always-on-the-move people
- relational > rational
- inspirational > institutional
- missional:
 - 432 Patrick to Ireland
 - 560 Columba from Ireland to Iona
 - 591 Columbanus to France & Italy
 - 635 Aidan to Lindisfarne



Characteristics of Celtic Spirituality



1. Monasticism



Ascesis ("to live") in Celtic understanding:


- the 'come and see' of Jesus in John 1:43.
- self.
- and 'How then shall we live?'

 living from our hearts' deepest desire, to be 'at home with Jesus,' and at peace with our truest

asking the questions: 'Who is it that you seek?'



2. Sacramental Outlook



That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.

1 John 1:1



3. Contemplation and Mission



Mission as "being sent; being faithful to the task" – flowed out of the context of the monastery.



The monk [aka Christ-follower] is not defined by their task, their usefulness; in a certain sense they are supposed to be useless, because their mission is not to do this or that job but to be a person of God.

Seeking God in the heart so we can better serve God in the world.


